It also makes sharing images and albums extremely easy and works just as well on all platforms: iOS, Android, the web, and literally anything else with a browser. Finally, it also has a shiny new selection option that allows you to swipe your finger and use it like a computer mouse. Quite magically, it also allows you to search (and actually find) images by simply typing a few words like animals that will filter all animal images in your photo collection. Magic.Google Photos is probably the best app to keep your photos in the cloud, but when it comes to organization simplicity, QuickPic is always the way to go on Android. Its extremely positive notes show that the simple works: it is a lightweight application with a modern design and it connects to online storage servers. Snapseed was acquired by Google a few years ago for a good reason: it has an interface that allows you to easily edit images on your phone using an intuitive scanning-based interface. You have the powerful option of selective adjustments, so you can type on a particular point and change just a certain part of an image rather than the whole. Snapseed is ad-free, runs smoothly, and is probably the best way to edit photos on Android.VSCO Cam is an application by the Visual Supply Company, a company known for developing some of the best movie emulation filters for Adobe Lightroom, and it's no surprise that this expertise has resulted in a collection of amazing filters that you can get in VSCO Cam. The beauty of VSCO filters (or presets instead) is in subtle measure of artistic effects that will help you get an idea of the right amount of retouching needed for a photo, and also help you avoid over-editing your images. CamScanner is a great app if you want to make sure that all the important documents you have are scanned and residing safely in the cloud (and safely we hear away from thieves, maybe not so much from the NSA). CamScanner allows you to scan and modify them to look like high-quality PDF FILES, not some cheap photos taken on your cell phone. 500px Flickr EyeEm If you are looking for a place to share your photos, see other images, and participate in a photo forum that would enhance your photography, 500px and Flickr are two of our favorite places to visit. Both have new and modern applications with great visual style and both work very well on Android. A third option we like to use is an app that offers a more vibrant community where you can see the photographers highlighted and find inspiration. GoPro's transition into software territory began with the Quik video editing app and is a great solution that will automatically create engaging video compilations that you can then easily share. Magisto is another well-established videographer who will add music and effects to your videos and amentra them. VLC is known

for being the video player that can easily chew through all kinds of format with ease on the desktop, and it is just as excellent on mobile. After years of testing, the application is off beta and works solidly. Our previous favorite app, the MX player has been around for years and remains a great video player that we continue to use. Its scanning interface is custom-designed for touch devices: swipe left and right to jump backwards and move fast; slide up or down (on the right half of a device) to adjust the volume, and slide up or down on the left half to adjust the brightness. Spotify needs little introduction. The \$10 music subscription service lets you listen to more than 20 million unlimited, ad-free songs, a model that replaces the current buy-an-album. You also have Spotify free which does not require a paid subscription, but introduces ads and limitations. Sometimes you have to do something as simple as cutting part of a song. We've found that the Lexis audio editor does a good job as a wave editor, allowing you to cut your creations accurately and easily export. If you're a djay, chances are you don't count on your phone, but in case you're on the go or something goes wrong, Android has djay2. The app works great on modern phones (and not so good on slightly older devices), and when it works, it allows you a lot of options: to slow down and speed up songs, to some ingenious mixing techniques. If you're into music creation and want to create a few beats on the go, Nanoloop is one of our favorite tools on Android. Nanoloop combines sequencer, synthesizer and sampler in one package, and it's a very minimal tool but beautifully made to create electronic music. Then, if you're a music pro looking for an app to help you edit more complex projects, you can always count on Caustic 3 and FL Studio Mobile. These complex applications will work best on a well-powered tablet, where additional screen space is a welcome addition. Signal is an application which allows you to have private conversations via text messaging and voice calls. It's free, supports group calls and text messages, and allows you to share media. Best of all, it's open source, so you can rest assured that all encryption is done in an appropriate way and the ever longer hands of the government will not reach your privacy. The server also never has access to any of your communications and never stores data. It warns you about this and allows you to keep an eye on your battery life. BitDefender Norton Avast Let's be clear: unless you enter third-party apps or open shady files you don't know anything about, you don't have to worry about antivirus apps on Android. The intelligent sandbox mechanism on which the platform rests makes Android very secure. Still, if you have any doubts about your device, these three are the best anti-virus apps around. BitDefender comes at a high price, but does a great job, while Norton is a freemium app that you can explore, and Avast is a nice third option to have. Google Drive is deeply integrated into the Android platform and it's a great service. We rarely use cables to transfer files these days; just send them to this neat cloud application with 15GB of free storage that would be enough for many people. You can also buy a \$2-a-month plan that gives you 100GB of space, or pay \$10 a month for 1TB of cloud storage. Then you have Dropbox which also offers an easy-to-use app with a 1TB storage option that costs \$100 a year. It's an equally excellent choice and it's up to you to decide which one you like best (we stick to Google Drive because of the way it integrates with other Google services). Some updates have occurred in the meantime, but this was enough to push it to second place, behind the quite excellent AirMore which provides an almost identical functionality, without all the plush that AirDroid has been adding recently.
